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## IMPORTANT:

## CARE OF YOUR EK@ KNIEE

Congratulations, you now own America's Best Military Knife. This is not a run-of-the-mill camp knife to be handled casually; exercise extreme caution at all times. And, as with anything that is the best, it requires some care in order to maintain it in optimal condition. Here are some suggestions.

This is the finest Stainless Steel money can buy, but all Stainless Steel for knives must contain carbon for strength and edge-holding ability, and this is the component that is not absolutely rust-proof. Kitehen sinks are Stainless Steel, but they do not need to be strong or to hold an edge, so they have very little carbon in their content. We have found WD-40 to do a good job of protecting the steel. and this is the easiest way.

The best option - especially for long-term museum display or storage - is non-automotive paste wax - neutral paste shoe polish and neutral paste floor wax and neutral paste furniture wax are good choices (and are actually the choice of Amms Curator friends of ours who are now retired at places like the Metropolitan Museum and the Tower of London). Apply a thin coat, wait two to three minutes, then polish as you would shine a pair of shoes. Be careful of the edges and point (read the next paragraph!). Do this periodically depending upon use - once every five years if in storage; monthly if continuously removed from the sheath and used.

Important: When waxing or wiping down an Ek knife blade, do NOT hold a rag in your hand and move the rag back and forth. Reason: The blade can cut right through the rag(!) and CUT YOU! Instead, double up a rag on the edge of a table. Then draw the blade, from shoulder to point, across the rag and towards you, pressing down so the rag stays in place. Do this three times on each side one for each flat 'facet'.

Never touch a knife blade with your bare hands! This would be bad form - and the mark of a true amateur! This is because the blade is the soul of the weapon; it deserves respect (going back to the 1,100 's Samurai Warricis were entitled to cut down anyone whoever looked at his sword blade; and the Samurai Warriors were the only ones authorized to wear two swords!). It is also because your hands contain acid, and acid can etch any steel - including the finest-quality Stainless Steel used for your Ek Commando Knife blade. Grips are made for gripping, use them accordingly. (Note: Knives have "grips" or a "grip"; they do NOT have a "handle"; car doors, suitcases, file drawers and cabinets have handles?)

Do not store in a plastic air-tight bag or a tightly closed container, as condensation-and hence, moisture - can occur. Circulating air is always better. Long-term storage of a knife in a leather sheath can be bad, as leather can contain chemicals and acids from the tanning procoss, and leather can absorb and hold moisture from the air.
With many of our sheaths we supply parachute cord to use as a tiedown strap. This can be wrapped once around the back of the leg and tied in front of the leg. Or this material can be cut info shorter sections for lashing the shicath to your boet, M.OLL.E. gear/plate carrier, etc. Important: When cutting this material, immediately take a match or cigarette lighter and hold it, briefly, undemeath the cut end. This will melt and, hence, seal the material so it does not unravel.

We get requests as to "What is the best way to sharpen my Ek knife?". Those of us around here at Ek HQ have had, since 1982. state-of-the-art, powered, blade-honing equipment, so if we ever re-sharpen lonives we use that Michael S. Black, writing in Knife World magazine, reports his way of sharpening his Ek M5 Bowic after he used it extensively in field tests: "I took the new M5 inside and used a fine grit DMT Bench Stone to reshape the edge. This took about 10 minutes. Five more minutes on the gray medium Spyderco Sharpmaker hone followed by a few strokes on the white fine hone restored a hair shaving edge."

An M.D. who performs surgery and likes a sharp edge (and who collects Ek knives and says, "I love your steel!") reports best results with an Arkansas Stone, lubricated with WD-40 sprayed across it generously. He has found that a big stone ( $4^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime}$ ) works the best.

If you would like for us to re-sharpen your Ek knife, we will do so at no charge, IE you do ALL of the following:

1) Send your knife to us in a sheath! Otherwise it is dangerous.
2) Include in the package your daytime phone number and your return street address (not a P.O. Box - we ship UPS).
3) Enclose a check or money order or credit card information for $\$ 18$ (if in U.S. 48 or A.P.O./F.P.O, or $\$ 50$ if outside) to help with the packing expenses and shipping charges in sending it back to you.
4) If you want it retumed in a new Ek black box, add $\$ 7$ to the above amount and so specify.
5) On the day you are sending it to us, call us and let us know when we will receive it.
